PRE-ARRIVAL HEALTH TIP #5

Reciprocal Health Care Agreements

Australia has Reciprocal Health Care Agreements (RHCA) with nine countries. If you are resident of one of these countries, you are entitled to a range of subsidised health services for *medically necessary* treatment while in Australia:

- Republic of Ireland
- United Kingdom
- Italy
- Sweden
- Norway
- Finland
- Malta
- New Zealand
- The Netherlands

Generally, if you are treated as a public patient in a public hospital, your treatment is free, but you must have your passport with you.

Each agreement varies slightly, so it is important that you are familiar with your own country's arrangement with Australia. Medicare Australia has more information, including payment arrangements if you see a doctor outside of the hospital. Information on health care payment for international Pilgrims from other countries will be included in future newsletters.





Important Message for Package A Pilgrims

Just to let you know the WYD08 catechesis and accommodation teams are currently working together on the allocation of simple accommodation sites for Package A pilgrims.

Our aim is to make travel to and from your catechesis sites as quick and easy for you as possible. It's a major project and at this stage we are planning that you will know your accommodation site by the middle of June with plenty of time to research and plan your travels.

Please ensure that your name and details are in the registration system (and correct) and that you have joined a group.

PILGRIM VISAS

Australian Immigration would like to remind pilgrims who are not eligible for an Electronic Travel Authority (ETA) that they will need to send a visa application to their nearest Immigration office as soon as possible. More than 10 000 visas have already been granted but pilgrims must understand that the Department cannot guarantee that applications lodged after 1 June will be decided in time to travel to Australia. Apply soon to avoid disappointment.
